It encourages contributions grounded in newly accessible archival sources and engages with current historiographical debates in contemporary history, political history, and memory studies.

In addition to research articles, the journal publishes critical editions of archival sources, biographical analyses, and book reviews relevant to the study of totalitarian regimes and their historical legacy.

*Arhivele Totalitarismului / Totalitarianism Archives* is published twice a year, in July and December.
